

# Bomb Threat

## If you receive a threat







Keep the caller on the line as long as possible to learn as much as you can.

If you can, activate caller ID and note whatever the telephone displays.

### Immediately after the call ends









Call 911. supervisor.

Notify your If the threat was left on voice mail, do not erase it.

Do not activate the building alarm system to evacuate.

## If you receive a threatening email or message





delete the

email.







email as directed by officers.

activate the building to evacuate.

#### Be Observant

Note, for example, the exact time of the call and the caller's exact words. During the call, if you can, note or ask the following:

- When is the bomb going to explode?
- Where is the bomb?
- What does it look like?
- What kind of bomb is it?
- What will cause it to explode?

- What is your name?

Also take note of the following qualities and

- Calm, angry, excited, or stressed
- Slow or rapid

- Deep or high

- traffic, other voices, music, television,

If a written threat of an explosive device or other danger is received, contact the police immediately by calling 540-231-6411 (for Blacksburg campus) or 911. The threat should never be ignored. Once a threat is recognized, unnecessary handling should be avoided, but try to preserve evidence such as fingerprints, handwriting or typewriting, paper, and postal marks, which are essential to tracing the threat and identifying the author.
